New Sadr for MKA Ghana

r. Hanif Bipuah, a Public Servant working with the Ahmadiyya Muslim Education Unit, Kumasi, assumed office on November 1, 2022, as the newly elected Sadr of the Majlis Khuddam-ul-Ahmadiyya, Ghana. He took over from Mr. Nasir Ahmed Bonsu, an entrepreneur, at a handing over ceremony at the Ahmadiyya Muslim Mission Headquarters in Accra.

The Ameer and Missionary-in-Charge, Maulvi Mohammed Nur Bin Salih, who chaired the occasion, administered the oath of office to the new Sadr.

He praised Mr. Bonsu for his selfless contribution to the growth of the Majlis as well as achievements chalked during his tenure.

The Ameer and Missionary-In-Charge asked for Allah's continuous grace, protection, prosperity, long life, sound health and guidance for the outgone Sadr and his family so that he would continue to be of service to the Majlis and Jama'at Ahmadiyya as a whole.

He said the new Sadr and the entire Aamila were capable of the positions entrusted to them and should strive hard to protect and improve upon the gains that their predecessors had chalked.

Maulvi Salih said much was expected from those who were graduating into Majlis Ansarullah for their services would be needed at all costs.

The Ameer described the payment of chanda as an act of worship of true Ahmadi Muslims and would continue even though a time was coming when the richest organization in the world would be Jama'at Ahmadiyyat, but, even then, the payment of chanda would still be compulsory for each and every Ahmadi.

Mr. Bipuah was Naib Sadr, Northern Sector for six years until his elevation as Sadr. Before that, he was the Ashanti Regional Qaid from 2012 to 2016.

He requested prayers from the Ameer and Missionary-in-Charge as well as assistance from members of the Majlis to enable him to fulfill his mandate to the satisfaction of Almighty Allah and our beloved Huzur (May Allah Be His Helper).

He hoped that the inclusion of Missionaries in the National Aamila would translate into improvement of Majlis activities and programs and become a source of blessing for the National Aamila.

Mr. Bipuah commended the former Sadr for sacrificing his time and money in the service of the Majlis. In particular, he mentioned the donation of a car to the Majlis. The former Sadr served for three terms from 2016 to 2022. He leaves office still a Khaadim.

For his part, Mr. Bonsu listed the key achievements under his administration as the construction of Aiwan-e-Khidmate (Hall of Service) at the National Headquarters, Accra, refurbishment of Maqbara Musian (Cemetery for Moosis) at Kasoa, completion of Jama'at/Khuddam History Preservation Project, visits to every zone of the Ghana Jama'at and the implementation of 2% and 1% of Khuddam specific chanda, among others.

He expressed his gratitude to the Ameer Sahib and the entire Majlis for the support he received during his tenure as Sadr.

The new Sadr was born in 1985 in Nabulo in Sissala East District of the Upper West Region. He had his secondary school education at T.I. Ahmadiyya Senior High School, Kumasi, and graduated with a BSc and MPhil degrees in Biological Science both from the Kwame Nkrumah University of Science and Technology, Kumasi.

He is currently a PhD student in Environmental Engineering Management at the University of Energy and Natural Resources, Sunyani, and a final year student at the Ghana School of Law.

ational aamila of Majlis Khuddamul-Ahmadiyya Ghana were blessed with the opportunity to meet Hazrat Mirza Masroor Ahmad, Khalifatul Masih V, (May Allāh be his Helper), in a virtual mulaqat on 12 March, 2023.

A total of 41 National Aamila members, including 10 Regional Qaideen, were present.

Hazrat Amirul Momineen (May Allāh be his Helper) conveyed his salaam to open the meeting. He led members in a silent prayer. Thereafter Huzoor (May Allāh be his Helper) asked each office bearer, starting from the Sadr, Hanif Bipuah Sahib, to introduce themselves.

In the course of the self-introduction, Huzoor (May Allāh be his Helper) had some guidance for them.

Regarding the office of Umumi, Hazrat Amirul Momineen (May Allāh be his Helper) said, "Also, during Friday prayers, you should cover your mosque. Ask your respective nazimeen umumi to cover their mosques in their respective areas. During Jumuah prayers, Khuddam should be on

security duty there at the mosques."

The Mutamad, Irfan Essah Hammond Sahib, was advised by Hazrat Khalifatul Masih V (May Allāh be his Helper) to visit the national office at least once a week. He should train his naib who visits the national office regularly by giving him the needed directions.

Speaking with Mr. Alhassan Atta-Quayson, who is the Muawin Sadr in charge of Jaidad, Hazrat Khalifatul Masih V (May Allāh be his Helper) asked if MKA Ghana had any property, to which he replied in the affirmative and said that they had one at Osu, the headquarters. Hearing this, Hazrat Amirul Momineen (May Allāh be his Helper) said, "[In] Osu headquarters, you have only been given one room there. That is the property of Jamaat That is not Khuddam-ul-Ahmadiyya's personal property. Khuddam-ul-Ahmadiyya should also have some personal property; build your own separate office, purchase some land; ... don't only rely on the Jamaat's headquarters. You should have your own headquarters."

Relating to the office of Rishta Nata, Huzoor (May Allāh be his Helper) said, "You should try to make many matches. I have been receiving many letters from Lajna Imaillah members and Khuddam, as well, saying they want to get married but are not finding good matches. So, you should help them."

Addressing Abdul Rahman Abdullah Sahib, the Muhtamim Talim, Hazrat Khalifatul Masih V (May Allāh be his Helper) said: There are quite grown-ups and educated Khuddam-ul-Ahmadiyya members; you should prescribe some books of the Promised Messiah (on whom be peace) for them to read, or books of the Khulafa to read so that they can have good knowledge about their religion.

Huzoor (May Allāh be his Helper), speaking to Sadique Koomson Sahib, Naib Muhtamim Talim, said, "You should help your Muhtamim Talim so that more effort can be made to get more people involved in reading [the prescribed] books."

Huzoor (May Allāh be his Helper) advised the Muhtamim Atfal, Saeed bin Usman Sahib, to intensify efforts in updating the tajneed of the Atfal. In addition, His Holiness (May Allāh be his Helper) said, "You should also prescribe some religious books for Atfal-ul-Ahmadiyya according to their age group so that they can better their religious knowledge."



Hazrat Khalifatul Masih V (May Allāh be his Helper) added, "In this world, everybody is indulged, too much, in worldly affairs and worldly things, and there are so many programmes that are being shown on television. There are some other materials available nowadays on [the] internet and everywhere that can destroy the lives of youngsters. So, just to keep them streamlined. We shall make more effort for their training for their tarbiyyat."

In the area of chanda Tahrik-e-Jadid and Waqf-e-Jadid, Huzoor (May Allāh be his Helper) addressed the Aamila and said, "Khuddam-ul-Ahmadiyya should [contribute] at least 33% of the total amount realized by the Jamaat towards Tahrik-e-Jadid... this is how you can help the Jamaat by collecting chanda Tahrik-e-Jadid and Waqf-e-Jadid as well."

Addressing Abdul Wahab Suleman Sahib, Secretary Tajneed, Huzoor (May Allāh be his Helper) said, "You have to make more effort to update your tajnid. According to my own feeling, if I am correct, your tajneed is only up to 10% of the total number of Khuddam-ul-Ahmadiyya, because the bai'ats and the reports that I get from the Jamaat show that at least the number of khuddam should not be less than 200,000. You should coordinate with the Jamaat and ask them where those people are. If they are hidden, if the number is hidden somewhere, then unearth them. ... You will have to go to the remote areas to towns and villages. ..."

To Abdul Malik Hammond Sahib, who is the Muhtamim Umur-e-tulaba, Huzoor (May Allāh be his Helper) asked how many students were currently studying at university. Abdul Malik Hammond Sahib reported that 253 students were studying at university. Advising him about his department, Hazrat Khalifatul Masih V (May Allāh be his Helper) said "You will have to work hard to update your records."

Regarding the office of Khidmat-e-khalq, Huzoor (May Allāh be his Helper) encouraged the officers in charge to increase the number of visits to the poor by involving amila members at all levels.

Huzoor (May Allāh be his Helper), addressing the Muhtamim Ishaat, Fadl Rahman Essel Sahib, asked, "Do you have any Khuddam-ul-Ahmadiyya magazine that is being printed every month or on a quarterly basis?" He replied that they were currently collecting content and articles. Hearing this, Huzoor (May Allāh be his Helper) said, "Try to make it regular."

In the area of tabligh, the officer in charge was advised to set some ambitious goals with regards to the number of bai'ats. Hazrat Khalifatul Masih V (May Allāh be his Helper) said, "The target of 100 bai'ats should be given to the national aamila [alone]. And if you give the target to the mulk [i.e. national] Aamila and then to the Aamilas of majalis, it should go at least up to 1,000. ... Try to make some ambitious goals, then you can succeed."

Huzoor (May Allāh be his Helper) asked Naseem Ahmad Nyame Sahib, Muhtamim Tarbiyyat of the Northern Sector, how many khuddam offer their five daily prayers in congregation. Upon hearing his response, Hazrat Amirul Momineen (May Allāh be his Helper) said, "It's too small. Salat is obligatory." Huzoor (May Allāh be his Helper) asked if the rest were at least praying regularly or if they were missing the prayers. Naseem Nyame Sahib said that some were praying regularly but not reporting on the assessment platform.

Huzoor (May Allāh be his Helper) said, "Keep on telling them, from time to time, that salat is an obligatory thing and they should offer it regularly and better and in congregation. ..." Hazrat Amirul Momineen (May Allāh be his Helper) emphasized the importance of reading and understanding the Holy Quran.

The Qaideen Ilaqa were advisd to follow the same guidance given to the Muhtamimeen. Huzoor (May Allāh be his Helper) said "As Qaideen Ilaqa, they should work on all of these issues. This is how they can be helpful to the central Majlis-e-Aamila and Khuddam-ul-Ahmadiyya,"

It was quiet amazing how Huzoor's (May Allāh be his Helper) memories about Ghana were still fresh as he mentioned towns and personalities, he visited and encountered some 46 years ago.

In the end, addressing Sadr Sahib, Hazrat Amirul Momineen (May Allāh be his Helper) said, "Whatever I wanted to say, I have already told you during my introduction with your Mohtamimeen and now I have given you a brief sketch of your work so you [should] work on it. If you work on it, I think, insha-Allah, your majlis will flourish, insha-Allah! Allah, the Almighty, help you, Allah the Almighty bless you."







Sadr Visits UG AMMSAG

r. Hanif Bipuah, Sadr Mulk, visited the Ahmadiyya Muslim Mission Students' Association of Ghana (AMMSAG) Branch of the University of Ghana on Sunday, 2nd April 2023. He, and his entourage, joined members to have Iftar and observe Maghrib, Isha, and Taraweeh prayers at the Athletic Oval.

Mr Adams Dawood Oduro, the students' Imam, led the Maghrib prayers and Maulvi Hafiz Ayatur-Rahman Abdullah led the Isha and Taraweeh prayers.

In an address, the Sadr said the Khalifa had directed that the male and female students should have their activities separately to be in conformity with the Nizam-e-Jama'at, adding that Ghana was one of the new countries to have this structure as most countries already operated this system.

However, Mr Bipuah said due to financial constraints and other challenges, some activities could be held together. Even though activities were to be held separately, the observance of salat ought to be done together, he added.

The Sadr advised them to learn the Holy Quran and understand the prayers in their salat while in school as they could face challenges in learning the Holy Quran after completing the University.

Mr Bipuah advised the students to remain chaste and encouraged them to observe purdah in all its essence as it was the surest way to protect them from any form of temptation.

According to the Sadr, most members of his entourage had their partners from AMMSAG since the primary motive of forming the Association is to enable members to marry from within the Jama'at.


He was quick to add that AMMSAG should not be the vehicle to promiscuity but encouraged the gathering to be prayerful when selecting their lifetime partners.

He urged them to participate in the activities of the Majlis while in school because they were going to one day serve the Majlis Aamila at various levels, adding that almost all of the members of his entourage were actively involved in AMMSAG during their time in school.



Synopsis of Huzur's atba recent Friday Sermons

The Jumu'ah (Friday) prayer is one form of congregational worship in Islam. It takes place every Friday. Regular attendance at the Jumu'ah prayer is enjoined on the believer. According to a saying of Hazrat Muhammad(peace and blessings of Allah be upon him) this congregational prayer is twenty-five times more blessed than worship performed alone.

Spending in the way of Allah: Waqfe Jadid 2023

January 06, 2023

Huzoor (May Allāh be his Helper) recited the following verse of Surah Al-e-'Imran in the start of the sermon:

"Never shall you attain to righteousness unless you spend out of that which you love; and whatever you spend, Allah surely knows it well." (3:93)

Huzoor (May Allāh be his Helper) said: The Promised Messiah (Peace be upon him) while expounding this verse says that you can never acquire the true piety that leads to salvation unless you spend in the way of Allāh out of your wealth and possessions that are dear to you. You cannot attain true piety unless you spend for the welfare of humankind out of your precious possessions. Hence, Allāh has given such importance to financial sacrifice that he has made it a prerequisite for salvation, provided it is made with the sole intention of winning Allāh's pleasure.

The Promised Messiah (Peace be upon him) says: In this world, people love their wealth more than anything else. However, Allāh says that you shall never attain righteousness unless you spend out of that which you love. This is because sympathy and compassion for humankind require the spending of a large portion of one's possessions. Compassion for our

fellow beings and God's creatures is an integral part of faith without which faith cannot be perfected. If a person does not sacrifice, how can he be of service to others? This verse teaches and encourages sacrifice. Spending in the way of Allāh is, thus, the criterion for one's piety and goodness.

The standard and proof of devotion to God in the life of Ḥaḍrat Abu Bakr (May Allāh be pleased with him), was that when the Holy Prophet (May Allāh's blessings be upon him) appealed for contributions, Ḥaḍrat Abu Bakr (May Allāh be pleased with him) brought to him all that he possessed.

In the time of the Promised Messiah (Peace be upon him), the highest example of sacrifice for the publication of literature and the spread of Islam was set by Ḥaḍrat Maulana Ḥakim Nooruddin Sāhib (May Allāh be pleased with him). He wrote to the Promised Messiah (Peace be upon him),

"I am ready to sacrifice everything for your sake. Nothing I have is mine; it is all yours. My beloved leader and mentor! I say with the utmost sincerity that if all my wealth and possessions were to be spent for the service of the faith, I would have attained my ultimate desire." Many other companions of the Promised Messiah (Peace be upon him) also made tremendous sacrifices according to their ability. The Promised Messiah (Peace be upon him) once said about them, "When I look at their sacrifices, I am amazed." Likewise, in every Khilāfat after the Promised Messiah (Peace be upon him), Allāh has continued to bless the Jamā'at with members who make great sacrifices and set aside their own priorities. By the grace of Allāh, members of the Jamā'at take part in these sacrifices with great zeal. As a result, they receive not only the rewards of this world but their faith is also strengthened.

Huzoor (May Allāh be his Helper) cited many such instances from around the world. A Mu'allim from Liberia writes: I went to the house of a newly converted young Ahmadī to collect Chanda Waqf Jadīd but his mother declined because she had no money. After a while, the young man came running and gave me 250 Liberian dollars. He said that it was the money he had saved for his school fees and that he did not want his house to be deprived of contributing to the Chanda. A few days later, the young man told me that a relative of his had sent him 2500 Liberian dollars for his school fees so that he would not only be able to pay his school fees but meet his other needs as well. He said that Allāh had rewarded his sacrifice tenfold. Thus it is that Allāh causes people's faith to be strengthened.

was through the blessing of Chanda that she had been paid back the money she was owed.

A missionary from Nigeria writes that an Ahmadī friend from Kano State had stopped paying Chanda for three years due to unemployment, but he then thought that he should start contributing at least what he could afford. Barely three months had passed after this when he got a job in a company, and this strengthened his faith in the blessings of Chanda.

Abdur Rahim of a small Jamā'at in Indonesia says: I used to pay Chanda Waqf Jadīd regularly every year. However, 2019 and 2020 were difficult years for me. I quit my job to start a new business but the business also collapsed and I lost all my savings. Therefore, I could not find any means to pay the Chanda. Every day I prayed in Tahajjud and also wrote letters to Khalīfatul-Masīh. I then somehow paid the Chanda that I had pledged. A few days later, I was called for a job at the company from which I had resigned seven years earlier. It was by the sheer grace of Allah that I found permanent employment and a steady income even at the age of 51.

After relating similar faith-affirming incidents experienced by members of the Jamā'at from Senegal, Sierra Leone, Gambia, Congo Kinshasa, and Macedonia, Huzoor (May Allāh be his Helper) said: May Allāh enable those who have made these sacrifices to further increase their sacrifices. Those who are affluent but their sacrifices are not up to the mark should understand the Promised Messiah's (Peace be upon him) saying that God is in no need of your services, rather, it is His blessing upon you that He gives you the opportunity to serve. May Allah enable the affluent members of the Jamā'at also to understand these words of the Promised Messiah (Peace be upon

Huzoor (May Allāh be his Helper) then announced the commencement of the 66th year of Waqf Jadīd. Last year, members of the Jamā'at made a total contribution of £1,22,15,000 towards Chanda Waqf Jadīd. Despite the adverse economic condition of the world, this is an increase of £928,000 from the previous year. Alhamdulillah.

Huzoor (May Allāh be his Helper) announced the positions of various Jamā'ats in terms of collection. UK stood first, followed by Canada, Germany, USA, India, Australia, a Jamā'at in the Middle East, Indonesia, another Jamā'at in the Middle East, and Belgium.

In terms of per capita payment, the USA stood first, followed by Switzerland, Great Britain, Australia, and Canada. In Africa, the first ten countries in terms of the collection were Ghana, Mauritius, Nigeria, Burkina Faso, Tanzania, Liberia, Gambia, Uganda, Benin, and Sierra Leone.

Huzoor (May Allāh be his Helper) said: The number of people who contributed towards this Chanda has reached 15,06,000 with an increase of 61,000 during the last year.

Huzoor (May Allāh be his Helper) also announced the position of Jamā'ats within the UK, Canada, Germany, USA, Pakistan, India, and Australia. Huzoor (May Allāh be his Helper) prayed that Allāh may bless the lives of property of all the contributors. Amin.

Islam: The Perfect Religion, Quran: The Perfect Book

Huzoor (May Allāh be his Helper) said: Allāh says about Islām in the Holy Qur'ān:

"This day have I perfected your religion for you and completed My favour upon you and have chosen for you Islam as religion."(5:4)

Hence, Muslims are greatly fortunate that Allah has bestowed upon them a complete and perfect Sharī'ah. When Allāh says that He has perfected the religion, it means that all human abilities, whether moral, spiritual, or physical, can only be perfected by following the Holy Qur'ān. And when He says that He has completed His favour upon us, it means that it is only the Holy Our'an that fulfils all the needs of humankind and that there are no needs that have not been addressed by the Holy Qur'an, whether they are material needs or the means of attaining spiritual and moral heights. In this verse, the Holy Qur'an declares that the survival of humanity is now dependent on this teaching. This teaching is for all people and all times, whereas the teachings revealed to the prophets who came before the Holy Qur'ān were limited to their own ages. The Promised Messiah (Peace be upon him) says that this proves that the purpose of the coming of the Holy Prophet (May Allāh's blessings be upon him) has been fulfilled and that he was the perfect and last prophet who received the perfect *Sharī'ah*.

The opponents say that if these are the beliefs of the Promised Messiah (Peace be upon him), and he considers the Holy Qur'ān to be the last Sharī'ah and the Holy Prophet (May Allāh's blessings be upon him) to be the last prophet, then what is the purpose of his claim and what was the need for his coming in this age? In answer to this question, the Promised Messiah (Peace be upon him) said: If you were indeed following the teachings of Islām, there would have been no need of my advent. However, the fact is that the condition of the world in general, and of the Muslims in particular, demands a Reformer.

The Promised Messiah (Peace be upon him) reiterated time and again in his writings and discourses that, as a servant of the Holy Prophet (May Allah's blessings be upon him), he came to spread the Sharī'ah of the Holy Prophet (May Allāh's blessings be upon him) and the teachings of the Holy Qur'an to the world. This is the task he undertook, and it was for its continuation that he established Aḥmadīyya Jamā'at which is carrying on his mission in light of his writings and his commentary of the Holy Qur'ān. All Aḥmadīs should ask themselves to what extent they are fulfilling this objective. In fact, one of the ten conditions of Bai'at is that one "shall completely submit himself/herself to the authority of the Holy Qur'ān...". If we all follow this teaching during Ramadān, not only will we enhance our individual spirituality, but we can also create a society that resembles paradise.

The Promised Messiah (Peace be upon him) says: The revelation of God began with Adam, like a seed, and the seed of God's law reached maturity during the time of the Holy Qur'ān and became a fullgrown tree.

Describing how the Holy Qur'ān is superior to the words of any human being, the Promised Messiah (Peace be upon him) says: It is an established fact that any difference in intellectual and literary ability becomes apparent in one's speech, and it is not at all possible that those who are superior in terms of intellect and knowledge be the same as others in terms of eloquence. The truth entails another truth: that the word of God must be superior and incomparable to human speech in its apparent and intrinsic perfections.

Huzoor (May Allāh be his Helper) said: People who possess knowledge and spirituality cannot be compared to a common man. The word of God must be superior to the human word. Divine knowledge encompasses everything, and human knowledge cannot be compared with it.

Therefore, the Holy Qur'ān claims perfection in every way, and nothing can ever match or surpass it. Heavenly blessings and divine signs are only found in those who are fully devoted to the Holy Qur'ān. It is a special distinction of the Holy Qur'ān that those who act upon it attain extraordinary blessings.

The Promised Messiah (Peace be upon him) says: The eloquence and proficiency of the Holy Our'an has encompassed all truths and verities pertaining to the faith in a succinct manner. It has erased the false notions of other faiths. It provides remedies for all maladies. There is no truth that it has not expressed. There is not a single word in it that is unnecessary. There is not one statement in it that is irrelevant. Its eloquence is so perfect that it encompasses teachings for all people, from the first to the last. Its teachings are such that their interpretations provide knowledge for every age. Has anyone ever seen a book that encapsulates an ocean of knowledge in so few words?

The Promised Messiah (Peace be upon him) says: Allāh has repeatedly said that in order to attain salvation, one must, first

of all, consider God to be One and without a partner, the Holy Prophet (May Allāh's blessings be upon him) to be a True Prophet, and the Holy Qur'ān to be the Book of Allāh. God's curse be on those who claim that they can produce the like of the Holy Qur'ān. The Holy Qur'ān is a miracle that cannot be matched by any human or Jinn, and it contains knowledge and excellence that human knowledge cannot encompass.

The Promised Messiah (Peace be upon him) says: If I had not been given any signs and had not been blessed with Divine help, if I had taken a path different from the Holy Qur'an, or introduced something into it, or abrogated something, or taken a different path from the Messenger of Allāh, then it would be reasonable for people to say that this person is an enemy of the Messenger of Allāh and an enemy of the Holy Qur'ān. The fact, however, is that I have not changed anything in the Holy Qur'an, and I have not changed any part of the Sharī'ah; instead, I am ever ready to serve the Holy Qur'an, its injunctions, and the pure religion of the Holy Prophet (May Allāh's blessings be upon him).

Speaking about the Holy Qur'ān's teachings on justice and equity in light of the sayings of the Promised Messiah (Peace be upon him), Huzoor (May Allāh be his Helper) said: These are principles that guarantee world peace. If nations involved in wars understand these principles, peace can be established in the world. If they do not uphold justice, destruction is inevitable.

The Promised Messiah (Peace be upon him) says: If anyone could show me any truth that is not found in the Holy Qur'ān or any truth found in any other book that is superior to what is in the Holy Qur'ān, I will be prepared to accept the penalty of death. Today, the Holy Qur'ān is the only Divine Word that contains perfect teachings regarding *Tauh*ād and reverence for God. The Holy Qur'ān does not attribute any defect to God, nor does it impose its teachings by force. It corrects the flaws in people's words or deeds and provides defense against every evil when it spreads.

Huzoor (May Allāh be his Helper) prayed

that Allāh may enable us to read the Holy Qur'ān, understand its teachings and follow them in our practical lives, and that even after Ramadān, we continue to benefit from the Holy Qur'ān in the same way as we do in this month.

At the end of the sermon, Huzoor (May Allāh be his Helper) advised the members of the Jamā'at to pray fervently during the month of *Ramadān* that May Allāh safeguard the Jamā'at from the evil machinations of the opponents, that may Allāh shield us from their harmful intentions and bring them to justice. Huzoor (May Allāh be his Helper) also advised to make special prayers for world in general, as well as for the Muslims of Palestine that Allāh may protect them from oppression. Amīn.

Muhammad (sa): The Great Exemplar

Huzoor (May Allāh be his Helper) said: I recently delivered a series of sermons on the lives and sacrifices of the Companions of the Holy Prophet (May Allāh's blessings be upon him) who fought in the Battle of Badr. Since then, many people have written to me saying that this subject would remain incomplete without narration of the life history of the Holy Prophet (May Allāh's blessings be upon him) himself. I have delivered sermons on various aspects of the Holy Prophet's life; however, his life is such that it cannot be confined or encapsulated in any number of sermons.

I will, inshā'Allāh, continue to expound on the life of the Holy Prophet (May Allāh's blessings be upon him) from time to time. His example is the axis of our lives, and without it, our religion and faith cannot be complete. Today I will speak about the events of the Battle of Badr in relation to the life of the Holy Prophet (May Allāh's blessings be upon him), and this will continue for the next few sermons.

First of all, I would like to provide the background of the Battle of Badr, which also serves to highlight certain aspects of the life of the Holy Prophet (May Allāh's

blessings be upon him). Describing the causes of the Battle of Badr, Ḥaḍrat Mirzā Bashīr Aḥmad Sahib (May Allāh be pleased with him) writes in Sīrat Khātamun-Nabiyyīn that the disbelievers of Makkah adopted such a hostile attitude and devised such strategies against Islām and the Muslims, that they were sufficient reasons to initiate a fighting between any two peoples. They engaged in mockery and ridicule and obstructed Muslims from worshiping the One God and proclaiming His Oneness. They physically assaulted them, plundered their wealth, killed some of them, and insulted their women. When some Muslims migrated to Abyssinia, they even pursued them to the court of Negus to bring them back.

The Holy Prophet (May Allāh's blessings be upon him) himself was subjected to all kinds of atrocities. Eventually, a unanimous decision was reached among the leaders in the parliament of Makkah that Muḥammad should be killed. As a result, the youth of Makkah attacked the Holy Prophet's house at night to murder him, however, by the grace of Allāh, he remained unharmed and found refuge in the Cave of Thaur.

Were these plans and hostile attitude not declarations of war by the disbelievers of Makkah? Didn't the injustices committed by the Quraish serve as justifications for Muslims to fight back? Would any self-respecting people in the world accept such an ultimatum, as the one imposed by disbelievers upon Muslims?

Undoubtedly, if any other nation were in the place of the Muslims, they would have initiated a war against the disbelievers much earlier. However, the Muslims did not receive any directive for fighting from their master and leader, the Holy Prophet (May Allāh's blessings be upon him).

Following the migration, the disbelievers' first act was to search for the Holy Prophet (May Allāh's blessings be upon him), and it led them to the mouth of the Cave of Thaur. At that crucial moment, Allāh granted him special protection and veiled the eyes of the Quraish. They then went on to announce a reward of a hundred camels for anyone who could capture the Holy Prophet (May Allāh's blessings be upon him) dead or alive. Twenty-nine young men set out in pursuit of him. The incident involving Surāqa bin Mālik was consequence of this pursuit. Once again,

the Quraish had to face failure in their scheme.

Similarly, upon the Holy Prophet's migration to Medina, the Quraish of Makkah sent a menacing letter to 'Abdullah bin Ubai bin Salūl, the Chief of Medina, and his companions, accusing them of sheltering one of their men.

Upon receiving this letter, 'Abdullah bin Ubai bin Salūl and his polytheistic companions gathered with the intention of fighting the Holy Prophet (May Allāh's blessings be upon him). Upon learning of their plan, the Prophet personally met with them, offered counsel, and averted the imminent conflict. On the other hand, the Quraish of Makkah systematically incited other Arab tribes against the Muslims and prepared for fighing. As a result, all the Arab tribes around Medina turned hostile towards its inhabitants, and a circle of fire seemed to surround the city.

According to Ḥaḍrat Mirzā Bashīr Aḥmad Sahib (May Allāh be pleased with him), the first verse regarding the permission to fight back was revealed on 12th Ṣafar, 2 AH, almost a year after the Holy Prophet's arrival in Medina. Other researchers are of the view that it was revealed shortly after the migration, for it was immediately after the migration that the Holy Prophet (May Allāh's blessings be upon him) sent armed groups to intercept certain parties of the disbelievers of Makkah. Permission for defensive warfare was granted in the following two verses of Surah AlHajj:

Permission to fight is given to those against whom war is made, because they have been wronged and Allah indeed has power to help them —Those who have been driven out from their homes unjustly only because they said, 'Our Lord is Allah' — And if Allah did not repel some men by means of others, there would surely have been pulled down cloisters and churches and synagogues and mosques, wherein the name of Allah is oft commemorated. And Allah will surely help one who helps Him. Allah is indeed Powerful, Mighty. (22:40-41).

Huzoor (May Allāh be his Helper) said that these verses speak of protection for the places of worship of all religions.

After the obligation of Jihād, the Holy Prophet (May Allāh's blessings be upon him) took four measures to ensure the safety of the Muslims from the harm of the disbelievers. (1) He personally embarked on journeys and forged treaties with the neighbouring tribes of Medina. (2) He started sending small reconnaissance parties to scout the surroundings of Medina. (3) The arrival of these parties created an opportunity for vulnerable Muslims to migrate to Medina and join the Muslim community. (4) The Holy Prophet (May Allāh's blessings be upon him) initiated the interception of the disbelievers' commercial caravans passing near Medina on their way from Makkah to Syria.

At the end of the sermon, Huzoor (May Allāh be his Helper) spoke about the virtues of some recently deceased members of the Jamā'at and announced to lead their funeral prayer after the Friday prayer.

Khāwaja Munīruddīn Qamar Sahib: He was the son of Maulavī Qamaruddīn Sahib (the first President of Majlis Khuddāmul Aḥmadīyya). He passed away at the age of 86. He was a life devotee and served Jamā'at in various capacities.

Doctor Mirzā Mubashir Aḥmad Sahib: He was the paternal grandson of Ḥaḍrat Muṣleḥ Mauʻūd (May Allāh be pleased with him) and the son of Dr Mirzā Munawar Aḥmad Sahib. He was also the maternal grandson of Ḥaḍrat Nawāb Mubāraka Begum Sahiba. He passed away at the age of 79. He had the honour of serving for nearly fifty years as a doctor at Fazl-e-Omar Hospital in Rabwah.

Syeda Amatul Bāsiṭ Sahiba: She was the wife of Syed Maḥmood Aḥmad Sahib of Islamabad, Pakistan.

Sharīf Aḥmad Bandesha Sahib of Faisalabad, Pakistan: His son, Reḥmatullah Bandesha Sahib, is a missionary serving at Jamia Aḥmadīyya Germany.

prayer is a unique act of humans communicating to a Supreme Being. Defining a Supreme Being wholly relies on the cultural environment, up-bringing or the belief of an individual. Simply put, each individual has a sacred receiver of prayers. A cause of one's prayer relies on several, yet, personal expectations or wishes.

As people who believe in the existence and supremacy of Allah, there is a passionate belief that Allah, the Creator, is Omnipotent, Omnipresent and Omniscient. Allah is all-knowing, the most gracious, the most merciful. So, Allah has all powers to fulfill one's needs, yet, Allah grants one's wishes in prayer when He sees it deem fit.

Since a prayer is defined to be one's personal wishes, one can best put his requests to the Supreme Being. This also means that one can have wishes to effect in another's life.

This article attempts to denote a belief that one can offer prayers on behalf of another who is dear to one's heart — called intercessory prayer. This form of prayer would unarguably be swallowed in the deepest of sincerity and emotion.

Inferring from above, the relationship between one who offers intercessory prayer and the expected beneficiary must be bonded heavily. Talking of bonding, no two individuals bond deeper than mother and child.

A mother carries a child in her womb for months, goes through labor pains for hours,

and nurtures the child for decades. Sacrificing her needs and egos, a mother risks it all for a child. Mothers take all risk to bring joyful tears to children and they forever wish to see children stay healthy in all aspects of life. Mothers defend their children and at any cost.

Mothers do not only intervene in any possible crisis of children physically; they also intervene spiritually. A mother will spend much of her 'divine hours' pleading with Allah to intervene any possible difficult situation of her child, and the emotion that transports it makes it worth it.

As a vibrant, busy, smart and focused young person striving to make life meaningful, one rarely dedicates periods to effectively interact with Allah. Often than not, the vibrant, smart and focused young person may indulge in immoral acts. Hence, one may even doubt the purity of his own prayers.

This, compared to a mother, who is more matured understands various aspect of life; a mother who has been protective of her child from infancy, a mother who has been sacrificing every moment of her life for her child. This mother understands better the need to get close to Allah, the need to seek Allah's intervention, and when and how to interact with Allah. If this mother commits her prayers to the Creator, Allah shall surely listen to her.

Islam teaches that paradise is at the feet of mothers; hence one need not go far in search of paradise. Similarly, a mother's ill wish (curse) due to the displeasure of a child also takes quick effect. This affirms our culture that urges mothers not to say ill words to displeased children.

A hadith discloses that a young man who had been on his deathbed only recovered after his mother, who had not spoken to him for six years, forgave him. Another hadith confirms that the supplication of parents for the welfare of the child are quickly answered by Allah, the Almighty.

It is not surprising that the Holy Prophet (SAW) emphasized that compassion shown to the mother should be three times the magnitude of that shown towards the father.

In a recap, ill attitude towards mothers shall attract ill words from mothers; at best, the mothers may remain silent. On the flip side, good attitude towards mothers shall attract the commitment of mothers, and eventually, spiritual intervention.

Fellow brethren, understand the weight of a mother's words.

KNOW YOUR PROPHET

Prophet Muhammad (May the peace and blessings of Allah be upon him), the founder of Islam, had a childhood that was filled with significant events and experiences. Here are some key aspects of his childhood life:

1. Birth and Early Life:

Prophet Muhammad (May the peace and blessings of Allah be upon him) was born in Mecca, which is located in Saudi Arabia in the year 570 CE. His father, Abdullah, died before he was born, and his mother, Amina, passed away when he was only six years old. 5. Journey to Syria:

At the age of 12, Prophet Muhammad (May the peace and blessings of Allah be upon him) accompanied his uncle on a trading journey to Syria. During this trip, he encountered Christian monks and traders, which exposed him to different cultures and religious beliefs. This also shaped the prophet into a very fine business man who later became a trader himself

6. Marriage:

At the age of 25, the Prophet (May the peace and blessings of Allah be upon him) married Khadija who was a successful business woman in Mecca. Because of the truthfulness of the prophet, his wife,

Khadija, handed over her business to him to see to the affairs of the business. Their marriage was very successful because it was based on love, support and the fear of Allah. Their marriage lasted for 25 years until Khadija's death.

7. Spiritual Reflection:

Prophet Muhammad (May the peace and blessings of Allah be upon him) was known for his inclination towards solitude and spiritual reflection. He would often retreat to a cave on Mount Hira near Mecca to meditate and contemplate the nature of life and the existence of God.

v. Application Beyond Sacrificial Offerings:



The ijema'at were graced by the presence of the Regional Qaid, Greater Accra, Zonal Qaid and Missionaries in the Adenta-Madina Circuit.




Government officials and representatives from environmental organizations took

Seven Former National Officers Honoured at the 42nd Annual National Ijtema'a



The Spiritual Significance of Congregational Salat

n an address delivered at the 42nd Annual National Ijtema'a of the Majlis Khuddam-ul-Ahmadiyya Ghana, Muallim Ismail Ansah, the missionary of the Gomoa Eshiem Circuit in the Central Region, he emphasized the significance of congregational Salat, describing it as a hallmark of righteousness.

Muallim Ismail Ansah's speech drew from various Islamic teachings and texts to highlight the importance of congregational Salat as an essential component of a righteous life. He began his discourse by reciting a verse from the Holy Qur'an (2:22) that underscores the worship of the Almighty as a means to attain righteousness.

He emphasized the saying of the Holy Prophet Mohammed (saw) that "Prayer is real worship," highlighting Salat's central role in Islamic practice. Muallim Ismail Ansah noted the guidance of Hazrat Khalifatul Masih Rabi (ra), who urged Ahmadis to offer Salat that pleases Allah and endears them to Him.

Drawing on a Hadith, the missionary compared the daily prayers to an overflowing river that cleanses the worshiper, reinforcing the idea that Salat purifies the soul.

He further quoted verses from the Holy Qur'an (Surah Al-Maa'un:5 & 6) that caution against unmindful prayers, emphasizing that those who pray without focus or devotion will face the consequences.

The circuit missionary praised the practice of congregational Salat, stating that it holds great rewards. Citing Hadith, he explained that prayers offered in congregation receive twenty-seven times greater reward than individual prayers. He also referenced the significance of performing ablution, maintaining focus, and observing prayers at the appropriate time and place.

Muallim Ismail Ansah encouraged the audience to view their neighbours as those who can hear the call to prayer through the technology of loudspeakers, watches, cellphones, and other devices, emphasizing the importance of attending the mosque for congregational prayers. He shared inspiring stories of companions of the Holy Prophet who overcame obstacles to attend congregational Salat.

He concluded his address by quoting Hazrat Khalifatul Masih V (atba), who encouraged Ahmadis to offer Salat regularly in a congregation and to adorn their obligatory prayers with voluntary ones.

Muallim Ismail Ansah's speech served as a reminder of the significance of congregational Salat in leading a righteous life, leaving the audience with a renewed sense of commitment to this fundamental practice in Islam.

Obedience to Authority: A Necessity for Taqwa

Prostate Cancer: Navigating The Path To Early Detection And Treatment

As MKA Ghana continues to prioritize the well-being of its members, one disease that particularly demands attention is prostate cancer.

According to the World Cancer Research Fund International, prostate cancer is the 2nd most commonly occurring cancer in men and the 4th most common cancer overall. The Global Cancer Statistics 2020" reports that there were more than 1.4 million new cases of prostate cancer in 2020.

This has become crucial for society to unite in raising awareness, dispelling myths, and promoting early detection and effective treatment.

In this edition of The Khaadim magazine, we shed light on the importance of understanding prostate cancer, recognizing its warning signs, and advocating early detection and intervention to protect the health and longevity of our brethren.

Myth 5: Prostate cancer is a death sentence.

Truth: While prostate cancer can be serious, it is highly treatable, especially when

detected early. Many men with prostate cancer can achieve successful outcomes through various treatment options, including surgery, radiation therapy, hormone therapy, and active surveillance.

Myth 6: Only men with a family history of prostate cancer are at risk.

Truth: While having a family history of prostate cancer does increase the risk, most men diagnosed with prostate cancer do not have a family history of the disease. Age, race, and certain lifestyle factors can also contribute to the risk of developing prostate cancer.

Myth 7: Diet and lifestyle do not affect prostate cancer risk.

Truth: Diet and lifestyle can influence the risk of developing prostate cancer. A diet high in fruits, vegetables, whole grains, and regular physical activity can help lower the risk. Conversely, a diet high in red and processed meats and a sedentary lifestyle may increase the risk.


Myth 8: Vasectomy increases the risk of prostate cancer.

Truth: The evidence on this topic is inconclusive. Some studies suggest a possible link between vasectomy and a slightly higher risk of developing aggressive prostate cancer, but more research is needed to establish a definitive connection.

Having delved into some of the myths and misconceptions of prostate cancer, we will now turn our attention to what prostate cancer is.

Understanding Prostate Cancer

Prostate cancer is a form of cancer that develops in the prostate gland, a small organ found in the male reproductive system. The prostate is vital in producing seminal fluid that nourishes and transports sperm during ejaculation. As men age, the risk of prostate cancer increases, making awareness and regular screening essential to address this significant health concern.



According to the World Health Organization (WHO), prostate cancer develops in the prostate gland, a small walnut-sized gland in the male reproductive system. Prostate cancer occurs when cells in the prostate gland grow uncontrollably and form a tumor. If left untreated, the tumor can spread to other body parts, known as metastasis.

The prostate gland produces fluid that nourishes and protects sperm cells in semen. Prostate cancer is one of the most common types in men, with higher rates in older individuals.

African-American men, by extension, African men have a higher incidence rate and are more likely to be diagnosed at an advanced stage. An oncology expert, Dr. Maria Johnson, notes, "Ethnicity should be considered when assessing prostate cancer risk, as it influences both incidence and disease progression."

iv. Diet and Lifestyle:

Studies have indicated that a diet high in red meat and processed foods while lacking in fruits and vegetables may be associated with an increased risk of prostate cancer. Additionally, leading a sedentary lifestyle and being overweight or obese have been linked to a higher susceptibility to this condition. Experts recommend adopting a healthy lifestyle that includes a balanced diet and regular physical activity, which is pivotal in reducing the risk of prostate cancer. Members of the Majlis can take proactive steps towards safeguarding their health and well-being by making informed choices about their diet and incorporating exercise into their daily routines. v. Hormonal Factors:

Healthcare providers can implement targeted measures to optimize prostate cancer prevention and overall health by discussing these factors openly with patients.

Warning Signs and Symptoms

In this section, we will focus on creating awareness of the signs and symptoms of prostate cancer. In its early stages, prostate cancer may not present any noticeable symptoms. However, as the disease progresses, certain warning signs may manifest. Awareness of prostate cancer's warning signs and symptoms is crucial for timely intervention and potentially lifesaving measures. The signs and symptoms include but are not limited to:


i. Urinary Issues:

Changes in urinary habits are considered

Attention to urinary issues and seeking medical evaluation when necessary empowers individuals to take charge of their health and enables timely diagnosis and intervention if prostate cancer is the underlying cause. Regular check-ups and open communication with healthcare professionals are essential safeguarding prostate health and overall well-being.

ii. Blood in Urine or Semen:

The presence of blood in urine (hematuria) or semen (hematospermia) may be alarming signs that warrant immediate medical attention. Dr. Sarah Johnson, a leading oncologist, stresses, "Although various conditions, including prostate infections, can cause these symptoms, they must not be taken lightly, as they might indicate prostate cancer."

iii. Erectile Dysfunction:

Erectile dysfunction, characterized by difficulty in achieving or sustaining an erection, may potentially be linked to prostate cancer, particularly in its advanced stages. It is important to

note that various factors can cause erectile dysfunction. However, healthcare professionals, including urologists, recommend that persistent issues with sexual function should not be disregarded. Instead, they should prompt a visit to a healthcare professional to explore and rule out any serious underlying causes, including prostate cancer.

iv. Pain and Discomfort:

Prostate cancer may cause pain and discomfort in the pelvic area, lower back, hips, or thighs. These symptoms can arise from cancer spreading to nearby tissues and bones. Dr. Lisa Turner, an expert in oncology, emphasizes, "Any persistent or worsening pain in the lower body should be thoroughly evaluated, particularly if there's a family history of prostate cancer."

v. Unexplained Weight Loss:

Sudden and unexplained weight loss, not linked to diet or exercise changes, may indicate advanced prostate cancer. While unexplained weight loss can have various causes, it should not be overlooked when accompanied by any of the above-mentioned symptoms. In such cases, seeking medical attention and evaluation is important as it could signal advanced disease.

Promoting Awareness and Support

Finally, we will turn our attention to promoting awareness and support for patients with prostate cancer. Prostate cancer is a condition that can be managed effectively, especially with early detection and intervention. Promoting awareness and supporting prostate cancer patients and their families is crucial to combating this disease. i. Raising awareness:

ii. Encouraging Regular Screening:




